
Transitioning Children with FASDs into Adulthood

The Arc Texas

- 23 local chapters across Texas
- Provides wide range of human services and other supports to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families: advocacy, residential, educational, vocational, employment, and family supports
- Check out Arc Indiana's videos and webinars about transitioning to adulthood, guardianship and alternatives, applying for Social Security benefits, employment, and community living

Best Buddies Texas

Offers one-to-one friendship into adulthood, integrated employment, inclusive living, family support, and leadership development programs for individuals with and without I/DD in Texas

Center for Independent Living

- Every state has a Center for Independent Living
- Supports people with disabilities through peer support, independent living skills training, information and referral, individual and systems advocacy, and transition from institutions and secondary education

The FASD Collaborative

- Focuses on supporting the creation of fully inclusive communities addressing the needs
 of all individuals who are neurodiverse including the FASD community
- Provides virtual and in-person support groups, online webinars, and special interest groups

FASD United

- Serves as the national organization on FASD, supporting people with FASDs and promoting healthy pregnancies
- <u>Family Navigator Program</u> provides individuals living with FASDs, their family members, caregivers, supporters and professionals with expert, confidential referrals to resources and services, one-on-one peer support, and information on FASD

Medicaid Waiver Programs

Texas has six waivers that can serve children: Medically Dependent Children Program Waiver, Deaf Blind with Multiple Disabilities, Community Living Assistance & Support Services Waiver, Home Living Program Waiver, Home and Community-Based Services Program Waiver, Youth Empowerment Services

Parent to Parent Texas

- Provides one-to-one parent matches to help parents become experts in their child's disability, learn medical and therapeutic terms, and navigate services, therapies, insurance issues, and public systems
- Connects parents and caregivers of children with I/DD with trained mentors who have experience raising children with I/DD

Special Olympics Texas

Provides sports and social connections for families with FASDs and other I/DD

The Tanagram Way

Offers virtual social groups and activties: bingo, book club, music club, afternoon social group, caregiver corner group, pre-recorded art lessons

Texas Health and Human Services Commission

Long-term Care Providers

Provides information about facility-based, waiver, and community-based programs

Wraparound Providers

Provides strengths-based services that build on and utilize family and community support to prevent out-of-home placement and promote lifelong independence and self-defined success

Texas Workforce Commission

Pre-employment Transition Services

Offers services to prepare young adults for life after high school: job and college counseling, work-based learning experiences, workplace skills training and support, and self-advocacy

Vocational Services

Helps people with disabilities get ready for, find, or keep a job
