

What materials can be included on the Ready-to-Use page?

NPN-created materials that are ready for immediate download/use and available for use by the general public without additional permission.

How do I get my materials on the Ready-to-Use page?

NPN organizations should submit resources or products for inclusion on <u>the webpage</u> to ORAU. Email <u>Betsy.Smither@orau.org</u> and <u>Katherine.Chyka@orau.org</u> and include

- the product file or a URL to download the material and
- a brief product description including the intended audience and dissemination recommendations.

ORAU will process submissions and update the webpage.

My product doesn't fit within the categories listed on the <u>Ready-to-Use page</u>. Can I still submit it to be included on the webpage?

Yes. The Ready-to-Use categories will evolve as <u>the page</u> resources expand. ORAU will determine the best category for new materials and add additional categories as needed.


