#### Summary Report of FASD NPN Social Media Activity

This report summarizes 1) ORAU's bi-monthly FASD NPN Communications Bulletin issues 1 – 10, 2) an analysis of all FASD NPN posts related to prenatal alcohol and polysubstance use and FASDs from January 2023–September 2024, and 3) a detailed analysis of social media posts using the hashtag #FASDNPN. It also includes a list of actions to consider for enhancing NPN communication efforts, which were informed by report findings.



#### **NPN Content Stream**

Between November 21, 2024 and January 31, 2025, the FASD NPN disseminated **326 social media posts** about prenatal alcohol and polysubstance use and FASDs reaching approximately **1,549,721 people**. A selection of posts is featured in this section.

Birth Defects Awareness Month was observed across the NPN

#### Check out highlights and explore posts:

- <u>AWHONN</u> with <u>UAA</u> explained that <u>not all birth defects can be</u>
   <u>prevented</u>, but there are ways to <u>increase chances of having a</u>
   <u>healthy baby</u>
- <u>FASD United</u> reflected on the importance of <u>supporting those</u> <u>impacted by birth defects</u> and encouraged others to <u>share</u> <u>information about alcohol-free pregnancies</u> and <u>offer</u> <u>compassion to those navigating FASDs</u>

  for Healthy Pregnancies and Families (MAP) encouraged momsto-be to take steps for a healthy pregnancy and talk with their

  adults with birth defects; recognized the importance and impact
  of disability inclusion and a supportive community

- NASW with <u>UT-Austin</u> highlighted <u>social workers' role in birth</u> defect prevention and shared FASD stats: <u>1 in 7 pregnant people</u> drink alcohol; 4 in 10 of those who drink, also use other substances, most frequently tobacco and cannabis

MAP Champions are integral to sharing evidence-based messages on the promotion of alcohol/substance-free pregnancies, the prevention of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASDs), and the dissemination of FASD support resources to families. MAP Champions include medical assistants, medical assistant educators, and related roles who have successfully completed a Training of Trainers program. As MAP Champions, they are approved to train the curriculum, with past Champions conducting training for colleagues, students in medical assisting programs, and at AAMA chapter meetings and state society conferences.
