NPN Content Stream

Between July 26 and September 30, the FASD NPN disseminated **380 social media posts** about prenatal alcohol and polysubstance use and FASDs reaching approximately **3,479,107 people**. A selection of posts is featured in this section.

RECOGNIZING FASD AWARENESS MONTH

FASD Awareness Month was observed across the NPN

Check out highlights and explore original posts:

- ACOG explained <u>risks of alcohol use during pregnancy</u>, like teratogenic effects, and highlighted <u>obgyns' role</u> in screening and intervention.
- <u>FASD United</u> shared things to...
 <u>LEARN</u>: caregiver advice, contraceptive counseling needs, referral and diagnosis options, stigma's impact on treatment for alcohol use disorder
 <u>BE</u>: an advocate, a friend, an ally, a light, a reason
 <u>DO</u>: utilize the <u>Family Navigator</u>, help spread the word
 <u>SAY</u>: encouragement, constructive feedback and guidance, appreciation, honor and respect
 <u>SHARE</u>: the FASD United <u>Affiliate Map</u>
- MSU with NACCHO explained the meaning behind September 9th as FASD Awareness Day.
- <u>ORAU</u> shared <u>research findings</u> to encourage healthcare professionals and patients to communicate about the risks of alcohol and pregnancy.
- <u>UAA</u> with <u>AWHONN</u> shared their <u>position statement</u>
 and <u>encouraged asking patients about their alcohol use</u>.
- <u>UAA</u> with <u>NPWH</u> featured 'why stories' of FASD
 Champions hear from <u>Marilyn Pierce Bulger</u>, <u>Meagan Thompson</u>, <u>Alyssa Lantiere</u>, and <u>Maricelly Perez</u>.







- UNR with <u>AAMA</u> encouraged <u>starting a dialogue</u> about alcohol use during the walk to the exam room.
- UNR/MAP (Medical Assistant Partnership for Healthy Pregnancies and Families) highlighted things to avoid during pregnancy, stigma, the need for FASD informed systems, & the value of voices of people living with an FASD.
- UTA with <u>NASW</u> highlighted the prevalence of <u>drinking</u> <u>alcohol during pregnancy</u> and <u>FASDs in school children</u>


View a sampling of posts and like your favorites: What are FASDs and how common are they?

- A group of conditions that can occur in a person who was exposed to alcohol before birth. (MAP)
- Lifelong effects from FASDs can include problems with behavior and learning as well as physical problems.
 FASDs are preventable if a developing baby is not exposed to alcohol. (CDC NCBDDD)
- The exact prevalence is unknown, but a @CDCgov study found that about 1 in 7 pregnant people reported alcohol use, and this was more common among people who experienced frequent mental distress and who didn't have a primary health care professional. (ACOG)
- FASD can be a "hidden disability" that is often missed, misdiagnosed, or mistreated. Common misdiagnoses include ADHD and Autism Spectrum Disorder. (<u>FASD</u> <u>United</u>)

What are the risks of alcohol use during pregnancy?

- During pregnancy, alcohol can pass from the pregnant person to the fetus & affect its development. It's impossible to know which babies will be affected. (CDC NCBDDD)
- A twin study, published in Advances in Pediatric Research, found that the same amount of prenatal alcohol exposure can result in different outcomes. There's currently no way to predict vulnerability, and there's no safe amount of alcohol use during pregnancy. (ACOG)







What have we learned in the past 50 years since FASD was first identified in the U.S.?

- HCPs: Alcohol SBI works to reduce excessive alcohol use and is recommended for all adults in primary care, incl. patients who are pregnant. (<u>CDC NCBDDD</u>)
- Each person living with FASD is unique. Strengths-based research highlights how individuals with FASD shine and supports they may require. (FASD United)

How can we support individuals and families living with FASD?

 Early identification, support, and evidence-based interventions can improve outcomes across the lifespan of individuals with FASD. (<u>FASD United</u>)






Quick Tips

Continue using #FASDNPN on project-related social media posts!

The official NPN hashtag was created during the first Collaboration Office Hour on August 11. The group voted to use the hashtag year-round on partnership and project-related posts.

#FASDNPN has been used 80 times by NPN organizations

The hashtag supports collaboration on social media and amplifies use of consistent language. Posts containing #FASDNPN have received 599 engagements.



What are the top keywords used in posts that include #FASDNPN?

pregnancy is the top keyword used in posts created by the NPN. Since August 22, 19 posts contained this keyword. Consistently using the hashtag helps generate messaging insights from across the NPN.
